**Entries** to be staged on the day of the show from 8.00 am & must be entered by 12.00 noon. Entries must not be removed before 5.00 pm.

**Payments Of Prize Money:** Prize money will be paid by the treasurer after presentation of prizes on the day of the show. Prize money not claimed will be forfeited.

**All exhibits must have been grown by the exhibitor except Classes 32 – 35 Floral Art.**

No persons will be admitted to the hall during the time of judging except those authorized by the Committee.

## CLASSES

### **Open Sweet Pea Classes 1 - 6 inclusive**

- 1.. One specimen bloom of sweet pea, any variety
2. Six sweet peas – two varieties – 3 stems of each
3. Seven sweet peas – not less than 3 varieties
4. Three vases of sweet peas – 9 stems in each using 3 distinct varieties. Each variety to be staged separately.
5. Twelve sweet peas – one or more varieties.
6. Five sweet peas – one or more varieties.

### Novice Classes

**A novice is an exhibitor who has not won a first prize in the open classes.**

7. A single bloom.
8. Three stems, one variety.
9. Five stems, mixed.
10. A floral arrangement of sweet peas with any foliage and a container of choice (to be judged for effect).

### SWEET PEA CLASSES 11 - 13 MEMBERS ONLY

11. A bowl of sweet peas with own foliage.
12. Five sweet peas – one or more varieties
13. Three sweet peas judged for "perfume" only

### OPEN CLASSES

- 14.. Three spikes of delphiniums.
15. Vase of three carnations or pinks.
- 16.. Vase of Annuals, one variety.
- 17.. Vase of Biennials, one variety.
18. Vase of Perennials, one variety.
- 19.. One specimen bloom, large flowering Rose (H.T.).
- 20.. One miniature rose, specimen bloom.
- 21.. Basket of Roses with own foliage.
- 22.. Three large flowering Roses, mixed (H.T.)
- 23.. One bowl containing six blooms of large flowering roses, any variety (H.T)
24. Three stems of miniature Roses, any variety. (Cluster).
- 25.. Bowl of miniature Roses – 9 blooms.
- 26.. One stem Floribunda Roses.
27. Pot plant, Flowering.
28. Pot Plant, Foliage.
29. Pot Plant, Cactus or Succulent.
30. Six Pansies on a board.
- 31.. Six Violas on a board.

## FLORAL ART SECTION

- 2 Feet allowed for classes 32 & 35.  
2 Foot 6 inches allowed for class 34.
32. A Design completely inside a Fish Bowl no higher than 20cm/8 inches. Accessories allowed.
33. An arrangement Of fresh flowers & Foliage in a "Tea Cup & Saucer". Not to exceed 20cm/ 8 ins in any direction.
34. An arrangement in a Continental Style.
35. An arrangement of fresh foliage using mixed shades Of plant material. Floral Foam to be used
